We are sorry to say goodbye to our Chairman, Les, Carr, and would like to thank him for his hard work over the last few years.

Mini Bus: Due to the School closure, the mini bus has been donated to Bell View. The School were responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of the bus and the Trustees do not feel they could continue with the upkeep in the long term. We have also donated grants to Bell View to assist with transportation costs to help alleviate loneliness and social isolation, as well as contributing towards their gym.
