### <u>Update about proposals for Belford Village/Community Hall</u>

Thank you for the time and trouble you took in completing the questionnaire. Your views were both helpful as well as varied. These have been discussed in detail at a recent Steering Group meeting.

Since the questionnaires were completed there have been some two important developments the Steering Group need to share with you.

We understand that there is a possibility of a private, commercial leisure development in the village. This could provide some of the services that were envisaged in the possible Belford Village Hall proposal. However this would be a private for profit venture and at the present time there is no guarantee when or even if this will happen.

However information has recently been shared with the Steering Group that the Primary School Governors are interested in discussing the possible use of the school hall for community activities. They recognise that there is a lack of a large community space in the village and this is having a detrimental impact on village life. Details of how this would work in respect of bookings, charges, security and use would have to be discussed and agreed. How this would work without negatively impacting on well-established activities that already take place at the Bell View Centre would also need some careful consideration. This proposal could be either a positive interim or even longer-term development for the village.

One of the key things you asked for in the questionnaires was that the proposed community space offered access to all and activities across the age groups of our community. Activities offered would also need to be affordable for village residents. With this in mind the Steering Group are intending to explore both of these opportunities but also to keep exploring the option of developing a Belford Village/Community Hall. We will keep you updated and once things are clearer hold a public meeting to discuss detailed proposals.
