### 28th, 29th July 2018

The second Belford Arts Festival takes place on Saturday 28 July 10am – 8pm and Sunday 29 July, 10am – 6pm. 52 wonderful Artists and Artisans are exhibiting and selling this year along with Belford Art Club and Camera Club in 14 venues across the village; from a garden shed, to a Georgian Ball Room and even a former mobile police incident room. They will close the festival with a repeat performance on Monday 30th.
