For more than a century the auction mart was the focus of life in the picturesque market town of Bellingham. Farmers and shepherds came down from the hills to watch their sheep being sold in the mart's two ancient sale rings. But times change, with new animal health rules coming into effect the mart was forced to close in 2004. The Last Sheep Sale is a beautifully shot film encapsulating the atmosphere at Bellingham at the day of the final sale.

Plus The Tale of the Bellingham Bell, a memorable trip by steam on the old Wannie Line, made by amateur filmmakers. This charming short captures a day in 1964 when 350 Round Tablers took the now defunct railway from Newcastle to Woodburn via Morpeth, and 150 children from children's homes were taken in the opposite direction for a day trip to Morpeth.
